

## Dual Credit in Indiana

The six categories in which students can receive dual credit include:

- 1) **Concurrent Enrollment:** A high school or career center teacher approved by a college offers a college course in the high school or career center classroom (typically during the regular scheduled school day) for which a student can earn both high school and college credit.
- 2) **College Instructor at High School:** A college instructor teaches a college course solely to high school students in the high school or career center (typically during the regular scheduled school day).
- 3) **On Campus Enrollment in Classes with College Students:** A high school student attends a college course taught by a college instructor alongside traditional college students on a college campus (including satellite locations, such as evening classes in high school buildings).
- 4) **On Campus Enrollment in Classes Solely for High School Students:** A college offers a course on the college campus specifically for high school students, taught by a college instructor (including Summer Bridge and Upward Bound programs where college credit is offered).
- 5) **Distance Education:** A high school student participates in a distance education course for college credit, including online, video conference, and correspondence courses (either taught by a college or high school instructor approved by the college institution).
- 6) **Early College High School:** High schools paired with colleges that target students traditionally underrepresented in college education and allows them to simultaneously earn a high school diploma and an Associate's degree or up to two years of college credit towards a Bachelor's degree. The three endorsed Early College High School model sites in Indiana are: Ben Davis University High School, Charles A. Tindley Accelerated School and StoneGate Early College High School.
